The Daniel Shorey Fellowship

The Daniel Shorey Fellowship is intended to fund travel by graduate students in the Department of Classics for the purpose of studying the history, culture, or language of the classical world.

Graduate students in Classics of good academic standing may apply for a Daniel Shorey Fellowship in order to:

- 1. participate in a departmental program abroad, or
- 2. study at academic institutions outside the United States, or
- 3. facilitate research of their own that requires travel to sites of the Greco-Roman world.

The usual limit of an award is \$8,000. Applications for amounts over \$8,000 will be considered in exceptional cases.

Instructions for Applicants

Students are asked to submit formal proposals to the Administrative Assistant of the Department by April 1 of each year, for use in the following summer or academic year. A formal proposal must contain:

- 1. a letter of application requesting a specific amount and explaining why this amount is needed, and
- 2. a CV, and
- 3. a list of funding (including the name of fund and amount) received previously at the University of Chicago and expected or sought for the coming year.

Proposals will also be considered on a rolling basis in the event that a proposal cannot be submitted by April 1.
